Dublin
Visit Dublin and you will experience one of the most vibrant cities in the world. Recently voted Europe's friendliest city, Dublin dates back to Viking times. Through the centuries it has inspired artists, writers, poets, actors, musicians and great talkers too. Now it's a unique, upbeat, buzzing and captivating city; yet it still exudes a great sense of Irishness and of its own identity.

Given Dublin's rich literary heritage, it's no surprise that Dublin has recently been designated a UNESCO City of Literature. Be sure to take a light hearted 'Literary Pub Crawl' and join in the fun!

Belfast
Rejuvenated and revived, Belfast, Capital of Northern Ireland is a buzzing city with a unique atmosphere that's well worth a visit. With its compact size, picturesque location between mountain and coast, gourmet food, fantastic shopping and charming old pubs, this beautiful Victorian city has stacks of things to see and do.

As in most cities in Ireland, there's a strong music tradition and Belfast has something to suit all tastes. It has its own Grand Opera House, the wonderful Waterfront Hall and the Odyssey Arena. The Belfast Music Tour will take you on a trip to these iconic venues plus many more and enlighten you on the eclectic variety of music on offer 365 days a year.

Also renowned for its maritime heritage, Belfast is the birthplace of the most famous ship ever built - the Titanic. Be sure to include a tour around the shipyard of Harland and Wolff and the historical sites where the spectacular liner was designed and constructed.

Cork
Steeped in history, Cork City is fast gaining a reputation as one of Europe's hippest cities. The city centre is built on an island in the River Lee. The two channels of the river which embrace the city centre are spanned by many bridges, and this gives the city a distinctive continental air.

Exploring Cork is an enjoyable, multi-day pursuit. Play your own tune on the Shandon Bells, in the 300 year-old tower of St. Anne's Church, and marvel at the French Gothic spires of St. Finbarre's Cathedral. Foodies will be in good company here because gastronomy is high on the locals' list of priorities. Go along to the English Market, in the city centre since 1788, meet the characters and experience the colours, tastes and flavours. Delve into this urban hub, and you'll be rewarded with an astonishing array of excellent restaurants, chic bars and lively pubs.

Waterford
Waterford may be Ireland's oldest city but it's equally a fabulous blend of ultra-modern shops, lively traditional pubs and highly acclaimed gourmet restaurants. It's not without its world-renowned attractions, too. Home to the exquisite Waterford Crystal, not many visitors return home without acquiring some hand-blown glass perfection. Be sure to visit the city in 2011 to catch one of its many colourful festivals or to witness the splendid Tall ships sail into Waterford port. Just outside of the city, you will also find a spectacular coast line with miles of safe sandy beaches.

Limerick
Limerick is a bustling city on the banks of the majestic River Shannon. The city nestles between areas of outstanding beauty from the dramatic Cliffs of Moher and the Burren Country, north west of the city to the stunning Ring of Kerry in the south. Its past is etched from Viking and Norman occupations through medieval and Georgian periods to modern times. Travelling with **eurolines**

Eurolines coach services to Europe depart from Victoria Coach Station in London which is located close to Victoria Underground and Bus stations.



Check-In
Customers need to check-in at the Eurolines check-in office located adjacent to Gate 19. Check in commences one hour before departure and closes 15 minutes before to enable all customers to board and to ensure a prompt departure. Customers should have their Passports and other travel documents ready for inspection at check-in. A boarding card for each customer and luggage labels will be issued and customers will be advised from which gate their coach will leave. Check in time at other UK departure points is 30 minutes before departure.

Luggage
Customers must label their luggage which will be loaded into the hold of the coach and will normally remain there until arrival at the destination or interchange point. The Coach driver will load and unload customers' luggage but customers are responsible for seeing their own luggage onto and off the coach on which they are travelling.

Sea crossings
Sea crossings are made by Ship, check timetables for specific information. On arrival at the ferry port, customers will be required to disembark from the coach and pass through both UK and destination country Border Control offices and show their Passports. Normally customers are not required to be accompanied by their luggage, however occasionally Border Control officials do require customers to take their own luggage with them.

Refreshment stops
Refreshment stops are taken periodically throughout the journey providing the opportunity for refreshment and shipping services used by Eurolines provide a range of shops, restaurants and other facilities.

Services returning to London arrive in Victoria Coach Station's Arrivals terminal, customers making onward coach connections will need to cross the street to the Departures terminal


All coaches operated by Eurolines have a strict no-smoking policy and seat belts should be worn at all times during the journey.
